Tee It Up in Support of Science and Fun

- Join The Discovery for its inaugural "Scramble for Science" golf tournament -

(Reno, NV)- The Terry Lee Wells Nevada Discovery Museum (The Discovery) is hosting its inaugural "Scramble for Science" golf tournament on Friday, June 10, 2016 at 1 p.m. at one of Reno's best known and most player-friendly venues, LakeRidge Golf Course. This fun, friendly tournament includes a raffle, \$10,000 hole-in-one challenge, and prizes for the top three teams.

In true museum fashion, visitors can also participate in a variety of golf-themed science demonstrations throughout the tournament:

- Glass putting challenge
- 3D printed golf tee demonstration
- Stimpmeter demonstration
- Flop shot challenge
- Rocket powered trike vs. golf cart race

Players can choose between two packages, standard and VIP. The standard package is \$150 per player or \$550 per foursome, and includes a swag bag, two drinks, and a BBQ dinner following the tournament. The VIP package is \$250 per player or \$950 per foursome, and includes four mulligans (\$40 value), 30 raffle tickets (\$80 value), hole-in-one challenge entry, swag bag, two drinks, and a BBQ dinner following the tournament.

Check-in for the event begins at 1 p.m. and tee off with a shotgun start at 1:45 p.m. Proceeds support The Discovery's mission to inspire lifelong learning in science, technology, engineering, art and math for all members of our community.
