Labs and hands-on activities at Social Science will include:

- The Perfect Loaf Join The Discovery's educators to learn about the role of natural yeasts and fermentation in sourdough. You'll even create your own sourdough starter.
- Micro What? Ruth Gault, University of Nevada Research Scientist will present an interesting look at the human body, microbiomes and probiotics.
- Old School Pickles Learn how to make pickles the old fashioned way—fermentation at its tastiest!
- What's a Scoby? Folk Brewing Company will introduce you to scoby, and its important role in creating the perfect Lake Tahoe kombucha.
- Fermentation in Beer Experts from Reno's IMBÎB Custom Brews will help you understand how fermentation makes beer taste so good!

Guests will enjoy heavy hors d'oeuvres and libations from Whole Foods Market Reno, a live DJ and the opportunity to explore the entire museum.
