A Date with Sue, the Celebrity T. rex

The Discovery's latest Social Science event features food, wine and blockbuster appeal

Reno, Nev. – It's speed dating with a twist! The Terry Lee Wells Nevada Discovery Museum (The Discovery) will be hosting their latest Social Science event on Saturday, September 16 from 6–9 p.m. The wildly popular adults-only, brain-building event series offers guests the opportunity to wine and dine with Sue – the largest, best-preserved and most complete *Tyrannosaurus rex* fossil in the world – and learn about her compelling 67-million-year history.

"We anticipate this upcoming installment in our Social Science series to be as fun as it is interesting," said Patrick Turner, VP of Marketing & Communications at The Discovery. "This really is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. I mean, it's not everyday you have the chance to speed date a dinosaur and learn about the fascinating history behind her discovery. Sue's story is filled with all the scandal, suspense and science of a blockbuster movie. What she ate, who she fought, who fought over her, and how many millions of dollars were spent in her name will all be explored at the event. Labs, lectures and programming also include: fossils and dig pits, do-it-yourself dino keychains, dino movie posters, and a chance to explore the inner workings of a *T. rex* brain. In addition, guests will hear from President/CEO Mat Sinclair about his reunion with Sue and join University of Nevada, Reno paleontologists for an interesting look into the evolution of fossil hunting.

Social Science is a 21 an over event featuring hands-on labs, a live DJ, beer, wine, and sweet and savory bites from Whole Foods Market, Reno. Tickets to the event are \$15 for members and \$20 for nonmembers. Ticket price includes two drinks and complimentary heavy hors d'oeuvres.
