**RENO, Nev. (April 20, 2026)** – Pull in, sit back and enjoy an oceanic film experience at the latest installment of Science Distilled. The Discovery presents “Science Distilled: Drive-in for Science” on Saturday, April 25 from 7:30 to 9 p.m. at the West Wind El Rancho Drive-In Theater, 555 El Rancho Drive, Sparks. Doors open at 7:30 p.m.

The evening will feature the documentary “Hope is in the Water,” which explores the challenges facing the world’s oceans and the innovative approaches reshaping the future of sustainable fishing. Journalist Baratunde Thurston travels to Puerto Rico to highlight a sustainable diamondback squid fishery that emerged in the wake of Hurricane Maria. The film was produced by Jennifer Bushman, founder of the nonprofit [Fed by Blue](#), which supports sustainable seafood systems and ocean health.

Science Distilled makes cutting-edge science approachable through presentations on current and curious topics, held at hip locations in a social atmosphere. Started in 2016, speakers at Science Distilled events have covered topics ranging from genetics to climate change to personal energy independence.
